The Bible being used in the service today was dedicated and used at the opening worship of the United Presbyterian Church of Carlisle, Canada West on January, 11, 1858.

Only one photograph of the pre-1918 sanctuary of Carlisle Presbyterian Church is known to exist. On the Psalm and hymn board affixed to the wall in the photo are the Psalm selections for that week's worship service – namely, Psalm selection #98 (Psalm 122) and Psalm selection #8 (Psalm 16) from the *Presbyterian Book of Praise* (1897).

These same Psalms from the 1897 *Presbyterian Book of Praise* will be sung at today's service of dedication.
